Erasmus students involved in social activities during the SocialErasmus week

From the 4th to the 11th of May 2012, Erasmus Student Network will involve thousands of Erasmus students in social activities in the framework of the SocialErasmus project to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Erasmus programme.

SocialErasmus is the flagship project of the Erasmus Student Network in the framework of the 25th anniversary of the Erasmus Programme. Its aim is to involve Erasmus students in social activities that benefit the local community. The project is based on three pillars: education, environment and charity. Based in 36 countries at around 400 universities, the ESN local sections created many different activities linked to these pillars. Amongst the most widespread activities are visits to school to promote other European cultures, planting trees in the forest or visiting orphanages.

Created in 2010 as an international project of the Erasmus Student Network, the project aims to show the added value of the presence of Erasmus students within their host country under the motto: **Reach Higher, Go Further, Go Social!**
