


Results

- Institutional funding of APCs in gold oa journals established in more than 50% of all german universities
- OA articles in hybrid journals are mostly paid through other university / faculty budgets
- First nationwide transitional agreement with Wiley 2019 (hybrid oa publishing started 07/2019)
- MoU with Springer Nature 2019



Established monitoring for APC expenditures




EOSC trends for oa to publications






Situation before DEAL-Wiley

Benefits from DEAL-Wiley

- Legal reading access to all Wiley journals
- University / faculty budgets are not charged for publications in Wiley hybrid journals anymore
- Number of oa articles form german corresponding authors will increase (about 9,500 articles per year)




Challenges

- Transition from institutional library subscription budgets to publication based cost models
- Workflows need to be improved
- Subscription expenditures and publication output unequally distributed amongst participating institutions
- Finding a new cost model and decrease costs per article for the next contract

Checking and adjusting balances on institutional level

OA monographs

- Pilot project "transcript OPEN Library Political Science"
- Cooperative financing via crowdfunding
- Enabling oa publishing of monographs through community building
- The more libraries participate, the cheaper the oa transition per book and per library

Conclusions

- Enabling approach suitable for small, german language book publishers in SSH and for libraries
- First DEAL contract has to be used to improve workflows, to find new cost models and to enable HEI's with large publication numbers to be part in the future
- Monitoring of costs and oa shares for hybrid journals within transformative agreements

- Need for a consistent national oa funding and license strategy in Germany
- Achieving Plan S compliance for transformative agreements until
 2024
