The Freie Universität Berlin is among the leading universities in Germany and has joined the Academy in Exile consortium as part of its efforts to support scholars at risk. It hosts Academy in Exile's Critical Thinking Residency Program. As a distinctive feature of this new program, fellows are piloting a teaching-across-borders initiative and are strongly encouraged to join ongoing affiliated research projects.

Freie Universität Berlin was the first German university to join the Scholars at Risk program. It currently hosts more than 30 scholars at risk in various programs (PSI, Einstein, SFR, etc.) and is also host of the transnational mentoring-program Academics in Solidarity.

Dahlem Research School is the center for junior researchers at Freie Universität Berlin.

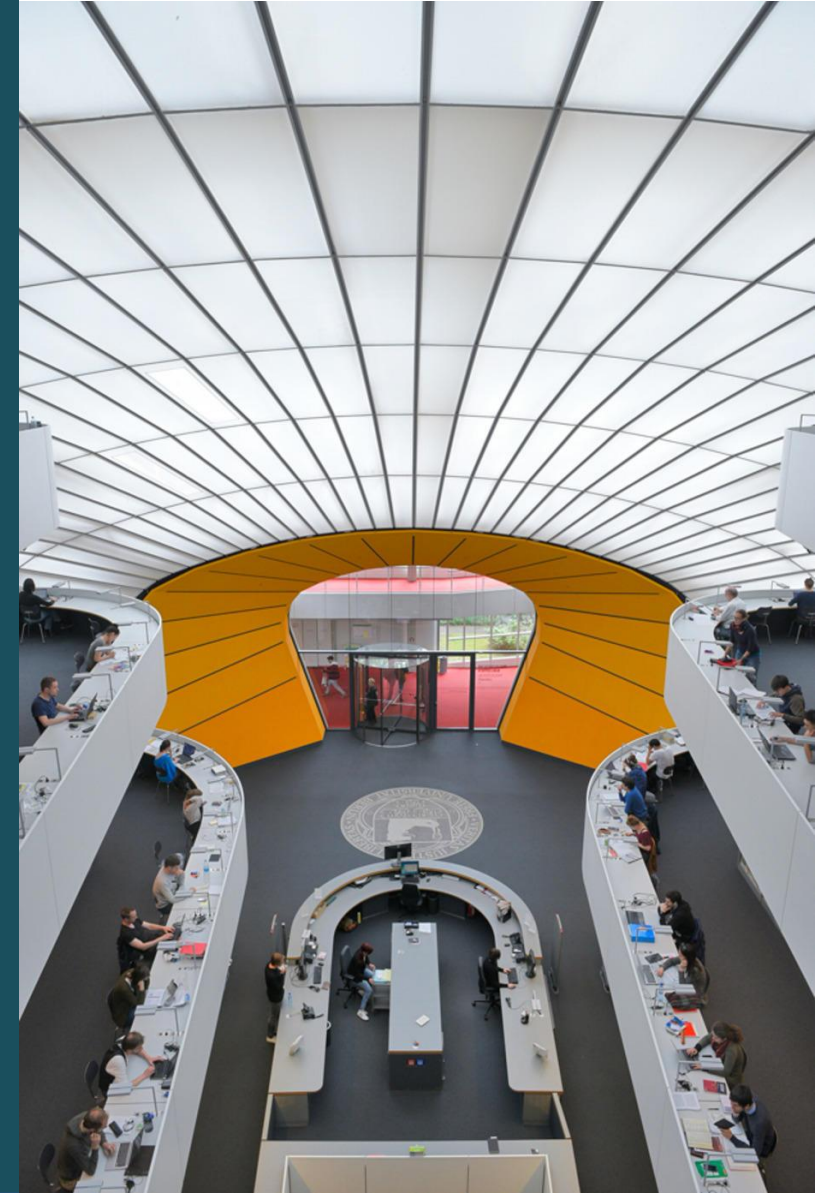

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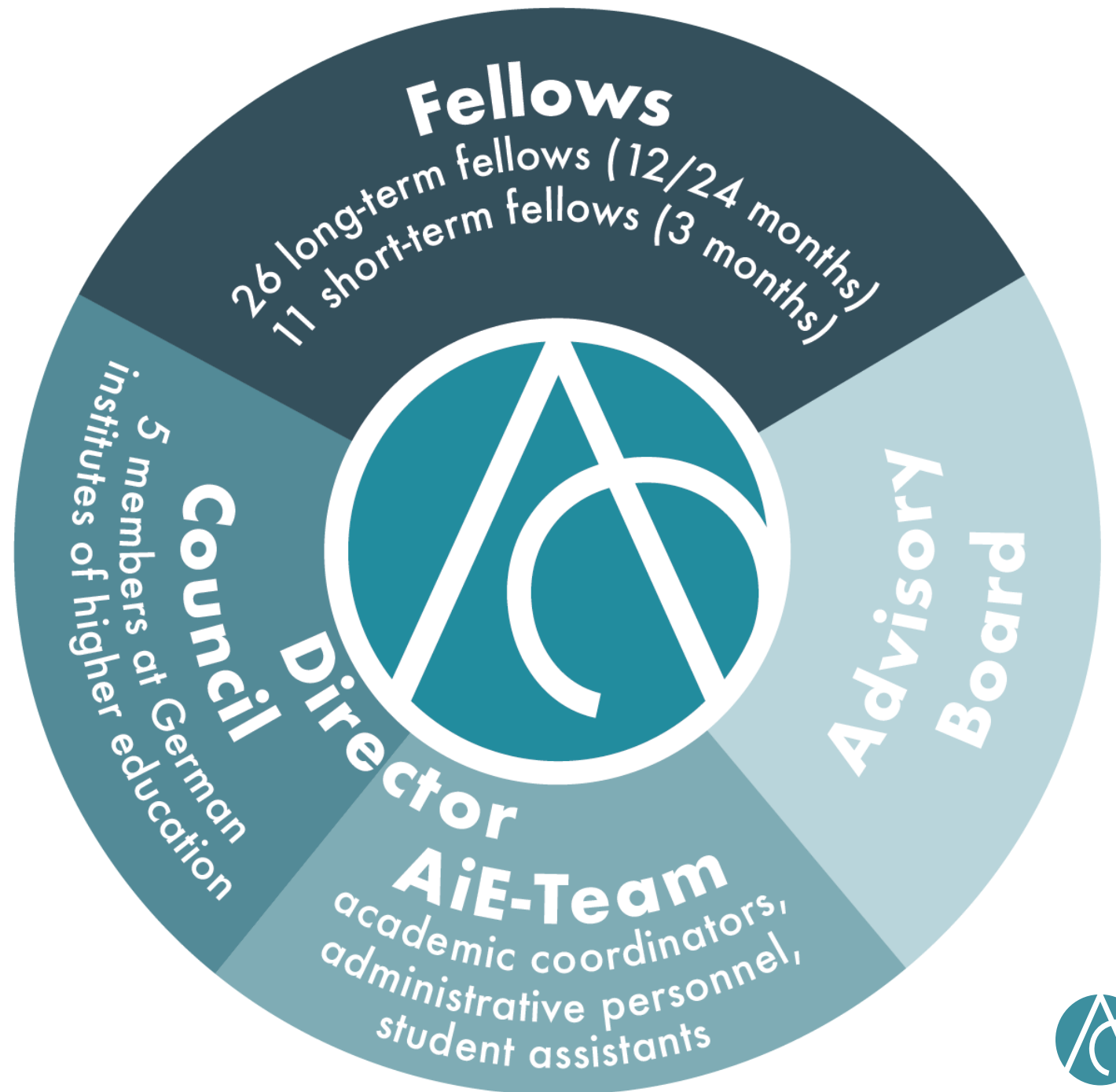
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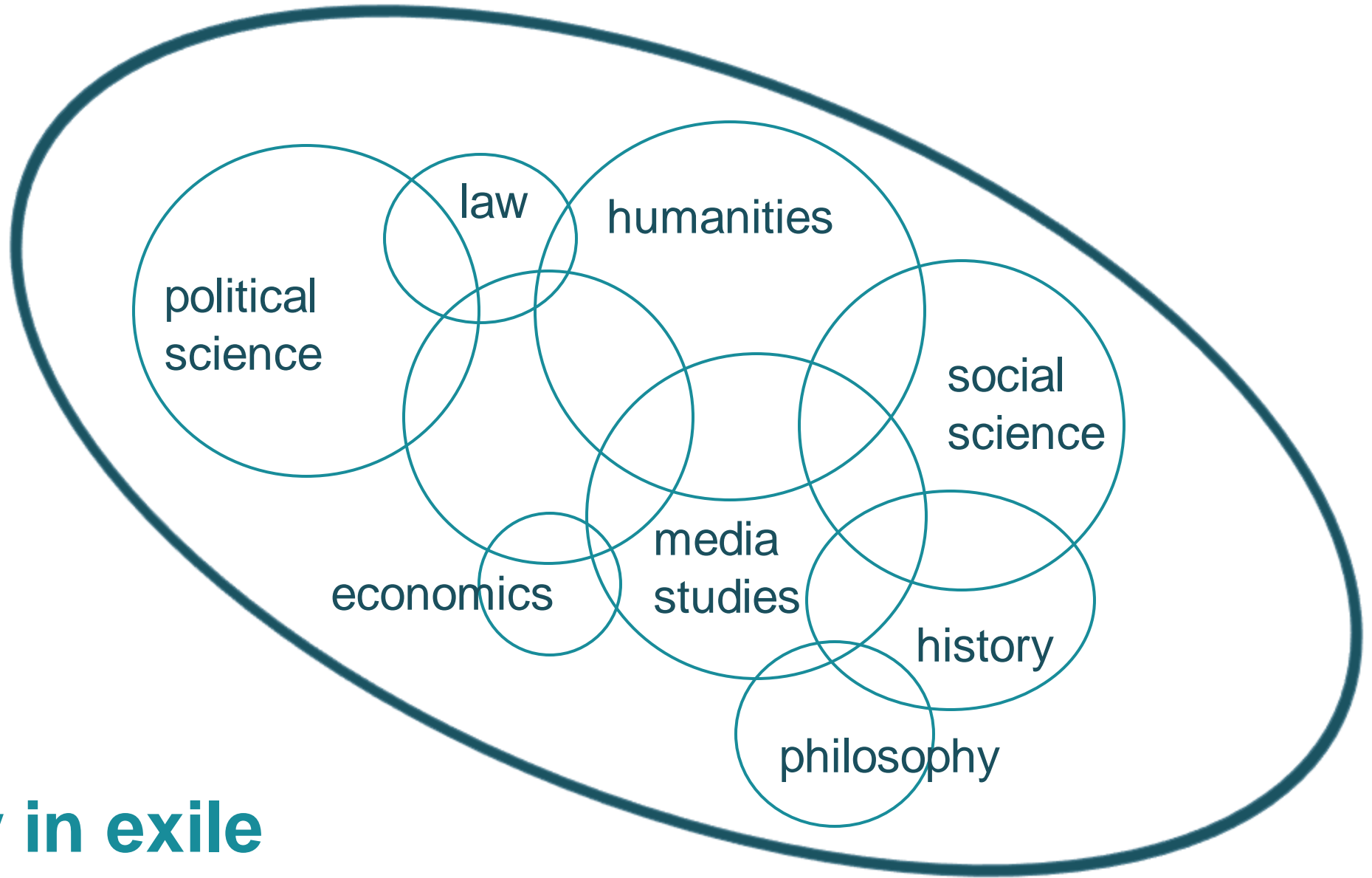

Evaluation Criteria

Fellowship applications are evaluated by the AiE Council in consultation with specialists in the field. Decisions are made on the basis of the applicant's academic merit, 'at risk' status, and potential contribution to the research profile and agenda of AiE:

Academic Merit

Academic merit is defined in terms of the strength of the research proposal and the quality of the applicant's publications.



Evaluation Criteria

At risk

Eligible are international scholars (all countries) with a PhD in the humanities, social sciences, or law, who are at risk because of their academic work and/or civic engagement in human rights, democracy, and the pursuit of academic freedom.

Potential contribution to the research profile and agenda of AiE

Applicants must demonstrate the potential for furthering the agenda of AiE and the potential for close collaboration with the cohort.



Creating a Network of Solidarity

The **Academics in Solidarity** program intends to create a transnational network of solidarity that fosters academic freedom and promotes the advancement of durable research collaborations. In order to achieve this aim, a series of training workshops and networking events will be organized in Germany, Lebanon and Jordan throughout 2019–2021. Academics in Solidarity further seeks to establish connections with other initiatives addressing endangered scholars at local, national and international levels to support the effective coordination of activities and explore opportunities for fruitful synergies.
