Whereas the nature of the doctorate is still influenced by the local contexts, there are **shared contemporary effects of globalization** on doctoral education. It is reflected in much higher mobility rates, world-wide recruiting strategies for the best talents and subsequent internationalization of the doctoral population. **Internationalization** brings supervisory styles which are as **diverse** as the contexts and traditions in which they exist. This **richness and complexity** deserve attention and doctoral supervisors need support to better cope with these new challenges and demands. Sessions in **small working groups** and inputs from experts will provide an opportunity for intensive discussion, to **share** experience and good practices, to **understand** how others operate and to **reflect** on these approaches. As a result, participants will be equipped with information allowing them to develop **new strategies to support supervision in a global context.**
