

Higher Education in Norway


- National Education System

- 2003: Reform of higher education system
 - Bologna follow-up
 - "Internationalisation for all"
 - Change of funding system for HEIs
- 2009: White Paper: Quality, relevance & stragegic partnerships




FS - Modules and subsystems

The Capacity of FS - UiO Perspective

- 45 000 applicants with more than
 220 000 courses in May July
- 45 000 candidates for exam every term
- 30 000 term registrations and payments in the beginning of every semester

FS - Disadvantages

- Rigid, less flexible and dynamic system
- Takes time to make changes / influence
- Privacy / data protection e.g. application process for int. students
- Lack of interaction with other SIS' world wide

FS – Advantages

- Application process
- National database
- Supports the national HE funding system
- Comparable data
- Time / resource efficient

- Transfers data to NAG recognition of foreign credentials
- Huge data collection
- Various reports
- Emergencies / crisis management

RS3G Mobility project

Main objective

 Facilitate student mobility; one of the main objectives of European Higher Education Area (London Communiqué 2007, Leuven Communiqué 2009).

Specific objectives;

- Interconnect European universitis in a digital communication network
- Reduce administrative inefficiencies/problem in handling mobility data and procedures (Intra-university)
- Streamline the communication flow
- Digitalize mobility documents (secure, authentic, transparent, tamper-proof)
- Produce reliable and accessible mobility statistics
