Achievements of Students Study Abroad


From 1978 to 2012, nearly 2.65 million Chinese citizens went to study abroad

Roles the returnees play in China


- University presidents (77% overseas education background)

International Students in China





Achievements of Receiving International Students in China

- From 1978 to 2012, 2.3 million studied in China
- From more than 200 countries and regions
- Studying in 660 Chinese institutions
- > 9% scholarship holder students, 91% self-funded students
- Top sending countries: Korea, USA, Japan, Thailand, Russia, Indonesia, Vietnam, India, Pakistan, etc.
- > 40.61% foreign students participated in academic degree programmes.
