Kumu Art Museum





The new museum site is located on four hectares in Tallinn, on the limestone bank of Lasnamägi next to Kadriorg Park. The office of the President of the Republic of Estonia and Kadriorg Palace, which is a part of the Art Museum, lie in the vicinity of the art museum. The building has seven floors, including technical floors, and the total area is 23 900 m². In 2004 the new museum got its name – Kumu – in an open competition. The Kumu (KUnstiMUuseum) Art Museum is a modern multifunctional art building, which contains exhibition halls, a lecture hall offering diverse facilities, and an educational centre for young visitors and for art lovers.

1,5 h tour in the Kumu Art Museum

The tour covers all the exhibitions currently on display at Kumu. The guided tour will give you access to the permanent display of Estonian Art on two of the floors as well as the various exhibitions in the Great Hall and the Gallery of Contemporary Art. The comprehensive tour provides a good overview of the museum building as well as the current and historical art events.

Social programme on Saturday, May 29th 2010 Medieval Tallinn – history, culture, art





The tour begins with a coach trip to the historical Rottermann quarter that is situated in the very heart of Tallinn. This compact industrial district which in the beginning produced construction materials is a unique place for it's architecture. From there the tour will continue to the Kadriorg Park, the main recreation area of Tallinn, founded by Peter the Great in honour of his wife Catherine. You will walk through the park to a beautiful baroque palace – once the summer residence of the Russian czars, now the Museum of European Art. After the visit to the Upper Garden you will return to the coach. The next stop will be on the Song Festival Grounds, where the famous Estonian song festivals held since 1869 take place – a splendid view over the sea and the Old Town of Tallinn and a marvellous place for a photo stop. The tour continues to the Pirita suburb, with the ruins of the St. Birgitta's Convent from the 16th century. The tour passes the yachting complex built for the 1980 Olympic Regatta. The bus tour will end in the city centre, close to the Old Town.

The programme is combined from two performances: **the Torch Tour on the Town Wall** (During the tour you will visit a medieval merchants house, a Town Wall tower, walk on the Town Wall on the west side and also view the Field of Towers. The tour guide will be wearing a costume and all the participants can walk with torches if they want to) and **Guided performance with singing** The performance participants will gather in the historical Horsemill (Hobuveski) situated in the end of Lai Street, address Lai 47. Everyone taking part of the performance will be offered a special herbal drink made after the recipe of monks. During the performance the participants will be introduced to the Masters customs, given information about limestone as the Estonian national stone, dolomite, and the medieval Tallinn's stonecutters. Also the there is an introduction about stone lintels and area stones).
