




A vision for sustainable development

- The vision=1 page text which gives a broad idea on our challenges towards a more sustainable university
- Strategic goals=more detailed listing of 23 sustainability goals
 I General principles
 - II Sustainable development in education and research
 - III Ecological integrity (7 goals)
 - IV Reinforcing the social fabric and wellbeing of staff and students
 - V Financial health and social corporate responsibility
- •Action plans 2012-2013: ad hoc
- •Test of a new method to translate our vision: roadmaps

Who's in charge?

- Our board approved vision and strategy and installed a steering group to implement our vision in 2011
- The steering group supervises the implementation of the vision and meets 2-3 times/years, our president is Prof. Dr. Em. Jean-Pierre De Greve.
- Members: academic staff with research interest in sustainability, workers unions, environmental office, VUB-based ngo, student representatives...
- 3 sustainability reports since 2011, reporting on sustainability indicators (energy, water, use of public transport and number of cyclists, paper consumption...) and archievements

 - Biosafety: 0,5 FTE
 - Environmental co-ordinator: 0,5 FTE
 - Environmental and mobility manager: 1 FTE
 - Support staff: 1 FTE

<u>Informal education</u>:

 $\underline{\textit{Past}} : \textbf{Student working groups on sustainability- ad hoc, support by Environmental office or EcoTeam; UCOS-initiatives (North-South themes)}$

<u>Since 2013</u>: a 3 years budget is allocated for financial support, the environmental office supports on project management, student affairs for communication...a formal project, 6 eligible projects since May 2013
