

Strategic Framework

- Strategy 2020
 - > A university transcending borders
 - > A university for research-based education
- Action Plan for Internationalisation
 - > international profile
 - Increased cooperation with foreign institutions
 - => UiO shall develop a clear, common policy for the creation of joint degrees at master's and doctoral levels, based upon current research collaborations
- Annual Plans 2012-14 and 2013-15
 - ➤ At least 20 Joint Degrees by the end of 2016

The UiO Policy for the development of Joint Degrees

- UiO regards Joint Degrees as an important tool in achieving the aim of increased internationalisation stated in Strategy 2020 and stressed in the Action Plan
- The Policy contains three major principles which shall be paramount in creating Joint Degrees at the UiO

1. Quality:

- Joint Degrees shall be established in strong areas and in areas with high potential together with leading universities
 - Academic quality
 - Good partners
 - > Added Value
 - Strong research areas -> internationally competitive programmes
 - Ensure stable and attractive study programmes in smaller academic areas

2. Sustainability

- Joint Degrees shall aim at providing strong and sustainable study programmes through collaboration encompassing both education and research
 - > Based on existing research cooperation
 - > Part of the regular UiO programme portfolio
 - ➤ UiO shall seek external financing to develop and/or run Joint Degrees when possible

3. Approval and authorization

- All Joint Degree initiatives are to be formally approved at all levels in the organization
 - ➤ The same regulations and deadlines as for other UiO study programmes apply
 - ➤ Initiatives must have support in the department and be formally approved by the faculty before being presented to the Rector or University Board

The initial process at the UiO

- 1. Joint Degree initiative
- 2. Departmental support
- 3. Faculty approval
 - International Coordinator
 - Faculty Leadership
- 4. Central Administration
 - Joint Degrees Team: Advice throughout the process and quality assurance
- 5. Approval by the University Board or Rector
