POSTER SESSION

Call for participation in the Poster Session

The aim of this session is to offer the participants of the UNICA 5th Scholarly Communication Seminar the opportunity to share information about new projects and developments in the Libraries and to highlight some of the initiatives within the scope of the seminar theme “*Find it, Get it, Use it, Store it*”. We seek reports of projects and cases that illustrate efficient means of information search, retrieval, usage and/or archiving implemented in UNICA university libraries.

Posters will be displayed outside the Main Auditorium on Monday 8th November. Participants in the conference will then have the opportunity to view the posters and to talk to the author(s). Authors are expected to be present at the poster stand on 8th November during the breaks and during the poster session.

FORMAT

- Posters shall be **A1 (594 x 841 mm) size**.
- Portrait or landscape format can be used.
- Minimum font size is 24 point (recommended)
- Presentations are welcomed in English.

PROCEDURE

1. Participants interested in presenting a poster are invited to complete the attached form and send it with an abstract of the poster (maximum 400 words) to **both**:

2. The Scholarly Communication Organizing Committee will review all the poster submissions and will select the posters to be presented. Successful applicants will be contacted by 4 October. Guidelines for printing and other useful information will be provided.
3. Authors of accepted posters should still register for the conference as normal.

Notification of poster acceptance. Guidelines for printing and other useful information will be provided to authors.
