

TARGET: 50 senior high school students in Humanities and Social Sciences

TEATCHING ACTIVITY:

20 FCSH Professors and Post-doc Researchers of FCSH research units prepare a special programme on different areas and topics, developing theoretical and practical issues on Humanities and Social Sciences

DURATION: 2 weeks (from June 29 to July 10)

MAIN GOALS: To introduce young students in the university activities and attract them to our courses



Summer School presents a set of intensive and short-term courses, open to all willing to participate Every year we offer around 100 courses on different topics in humanities and social sciences

The courses are anchored in the scientific rigour of the current work developed at FCSH/NOVA by all Departments and Research Units.

This a privileged forum for dialogue that deepens and updates the knowledge and cultural background of the participants



Key Facts:

- Starting in 2006, and since then, 1000 students per year, in average, attend these courses
- Every year, approximately 100 courses are offered in various scientific areas
- The majority of the courses are certified for elementary and secondary education teachers
- All courses are organized by FCSH/NOVA Professors or Researchers, that are experts in the several scientific areas



Main Features:

- Participation is voluntary but registration is required
- The courses are taught mainly in Portuguese (but some are in English)
- Students are evaluated if they apply for it
- ECTS are accounted for, in under graduated level diplomas or in the Supplement to the Diploma (in this case evaluation is required)
- Secondary and elementary school teachers can also apply for credits in all courses that are previously certified
- Being a long life learning programme, students with different scientific background and even students with no university background are accepted
- Classes may take place outside the FCSH campus when justified (eg. Museums, monuments, etc.)
