




### No incentive to save energy in dorms..!

- Students pay a fixed rate
- Energy wastage over 30% in UK (University of Sunderland)
- Insufficient awareness on energy saving amongst young people

This may lead to... very large bills when students move out to

private accommodation!






## SAVES is an inter-dorm energy saving competition

- SAVES (Students Achieving Valuable Energy Savings) is an inter-dormitory energy saving competition within 17 universities in 5 EU countries
- SAVES is the overall project name that covers the expansion of the UK Student Switch Off campaign
- Competition within/between dorms to see who can reduce their energy usage by the greatest amount or have the lowest usage per student (smart meter data)






### SAVES is fun!

### We focus on 4 main energy saving behaviours

- Wrapping up warm instead of turning up the heating
- Switching off unnecessary lights and appliances
- Putting a lid on the pan when cooking
- Not overfilling the kettle














### We engage with students throughout the academic year


#### Online:

- Dorm visits
- Student ambassador training
- Energy stalls
- End of year party for winning dorm!








### We've had a great impact so far

- This academic year averaged 9% reduction (4% last year)
- Saved over 3 million kWh of energy
- Saved over 1300t CO<sub>2</sub> (aim ~1500t)
- Over 17,000 students involved with the campaign
- Over 500 students trained as ambassadors
- Presentations at various conferences
- Swedish campaign won a prize







### Carbon savings vary based on carbon factors

UK 0.537kg  $CO_2$ /kWh Sweden 0.017kg  $CO_2$ /kWh Lithuania 0.270kg  $CO_2$ /kWh Greece 0.720kg  $CO_2$ /kWh

Cyprus 0.732kg CO<sub>2</sub>/kWh







## Green Impact takes a holistic approach to Sustainability




















#### Welcome to Green Impact!

Green Impact is an environmental accreditation scheme with an awards element designed for the Civic Centre. The scheme is delivered by NUS, in partnership with West Lothian Council who is the first Local Authority to take part in the programme in Scotland.

Green Impact at the Civic Centre will focus on the whole building, so both council and community planning partner staff can get involved.

Each council service unit or partner presence in the Civic Centre is a Green Impact team and can use this workbook to complete criteria and collect points.


Remember to also upload evidence of the criteria completed as the workbooks will be audited at the end of this cycle, prior to accreditation awards and a
