



- 42 students from 11 countries
- 15 students out of Partner Fudan University (China)
- 9 students from Partner Seoultech University (Korea)
- Partnership with Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation
- More than 80 applications to participate in Summer University (around 10 students are going to come back next year)
- There were 24 courses in English represented, 12 of them were accomplished
- The majority of students took per 6
 ECTS credits, a bit less took per 12
 credits, max credits that were taken
 is 18.
- There were around 15 active buddies who helped foreigners
