University of Sanctuary Movement

- A stream of the Cities of Sanctuary (CoS) Movement
 - CoS originated in the UK in 2005, a movement which holds the vision that the nations involved will be “welcoming places of safety for all and proud to offer sanctuary to people fleeing violence and persecution.”
 - *Places of Sanctuary* was subsequently founded in Ireland and Ireland’s first *University of Sanctuary* was Dublin City University (2016)
 - 7 of the 9 universities in Ireland now have University of Sanctuary status
 - University College Dublin became a University of Sanctuary in March 2018
 - Three principles of UoS status: Learn; Embed; Share
