✓Enact policies to promote SDGs in all aspects of academic life
 ➢E.g. compulsory courses for students (teaching)
 ➢E.g. use SDG's as a criterion for internally-funded projects (research)

✓Participate at THE Impact Rankings

 ✓ Facilitate collaboration with other international and national Institutions, through existing or new channels


- SDG4, quality education. YUFERING is expected to tackle global challenges

- ✓Cooperation with international institutions for offering joint postgraduate programmes of study
- ✓Organisation of Summer Schools for international students
- ✓Increasing the number of full-time international students
- Promote environmental sustainability through learning and teaching
