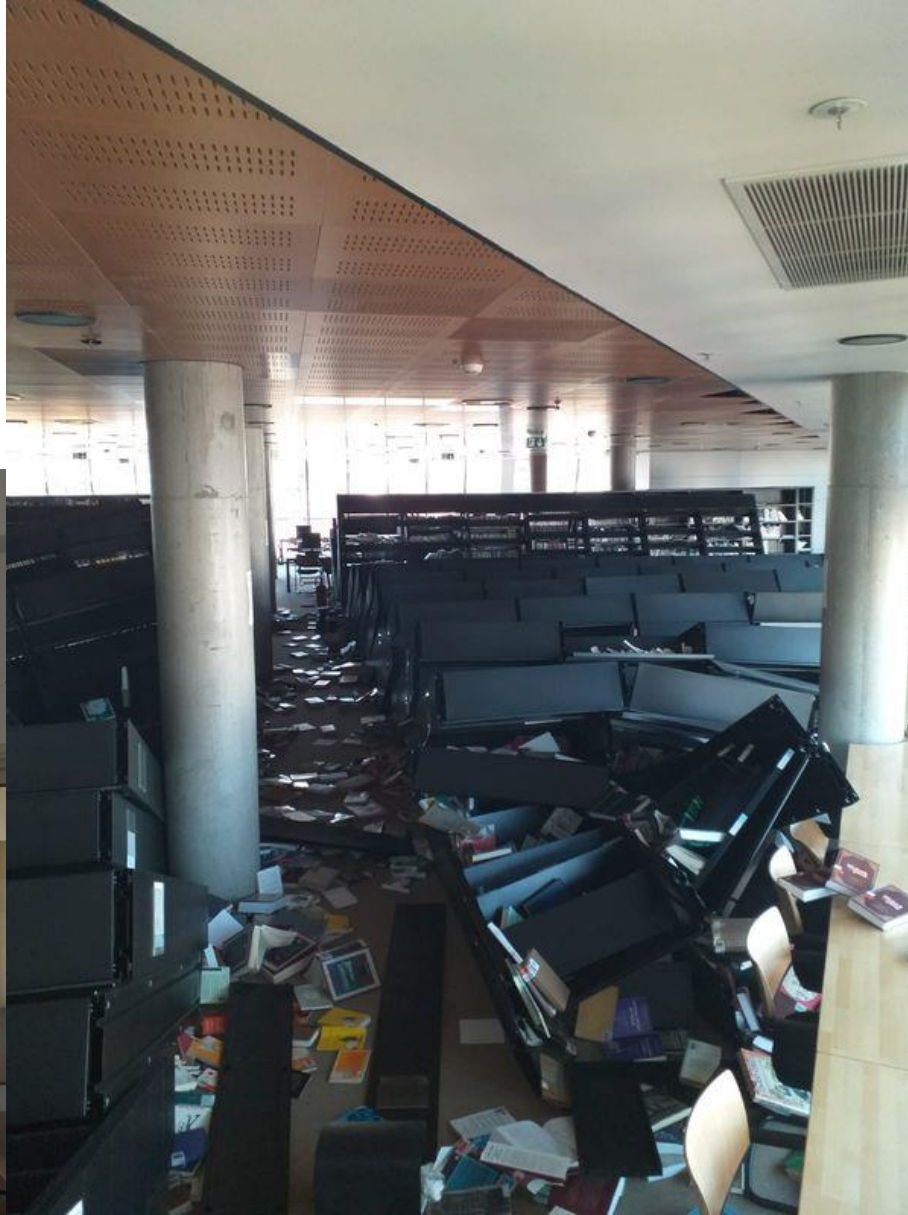

Monitoring and Evaluation of Scientific Productivity of the University of Zagreb - On-line Bibliometrics

- Acting as a support to the scientific research community, the libraries of the University of Zagreb are actively involved in monitoring and evaluating the scientific productivity of the University, with special emphasis on Open Science
- Bibliometric services at the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computing are automated through a Microsoft Access database, and the programmatic logic required by the reports is realized within the KNIME platform. Bibliometric reports issued by the Library are digitally signed and stored in the digital repository of the Faculty, where they are available via QR code.

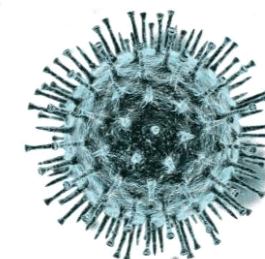
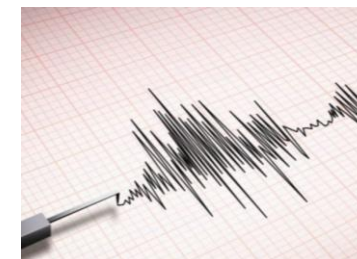

The Central Medical Library (CML) - Open Science for Government in Crisis Situations

Following the declaration of the outbreak of pandemic and the complete ban on the use of the University premises due to earthquake damage, The Central Medical Library immediately became involved in all activities of the home institution, such as:

- cooperation with teaching staff in creating customized lists of e-sources available,
- additional user education, communication through all available e-tools,
- screening of SARS-CoV-2 / Covid-19 sources,
- regular reporting to the Ministry of Health and members of the Croatian Civil Protection Headquarters to prevent the spread of coronavirus infection on about the most relevant published scientific papers on current topics.

The European Documentation Center (EDC), as part of the Europe Direct network, is an integral part of the libraries of the UNIZG Faculty of Law and Economics and has continued to support its users in the digital environment in accessing information on EU policies and law.

The digital library is an online collection of digital materials (monographs, articles, papers...) created by the Faculty of Economics, University of Zagreb. The project holder is the EFZG Library and Documentation Center.

It was built by Greenstone Digital Library open source Software

The mission of the Digital Library is to provide reliable, long-term access to managed digital resources to students and employees of the Faculty of Economics - Zagreb, and members of collaborative libraries.

The digital library can only be accessed via user access data.
