1. BIPs – core elements and their relevance for the institution and faculties

- ❖ Network-based action for small-scale cooperation
- ❖ Group activity
- ❖ Target groups: students, PhD and staff
- ❖ (funded) short-term mobility with virtual element(s)
- ❖ Funding via mobility grants per partner & additional organisational funding



2. Implementing a new mobility format – key factors for success

(1) Faculty

- ❖ Building on strong (faculty-based) partnerships
- ❖ Co-creating the project:
 - ❖ Faculty-based initiative, based on shared (research/teaching) interests
 - ❖ Structure & timing of activities
 - ❖ Hosting of short-term physical mobility
 - ❖ Funding/budget
- ❖ Recognition (min. 3 ECTS) per partner
- ❖ Integrating relevant virtual component



2. Implementing a new mobility format – key factors for success

(2) Administration (central/decentral)

- ❖ Communication & dissemination
- ❖ Ressources (staff; technical equipment; etc.)
- ❖ Organizational issues:
 - ❖ short-term registration
 - ❖ access to HEI infrastructure for participants
 - ❖ Insurance
 - ❖ Housing



3. BIPs as a strategic tool

- ✓ **Strategic priorities of the institution**
 - Supporting EUN activities
 - Strengthening strategic partnerships & networks
- ✓ **Strategic priorities of the Erasmus+ Program**
 - Projects on inclusion, sustainability
 - Offering inclusive activities
- ✓ **Priorities of the faculties / academic staff**
 - Addressing specific target groups (e.g. PhD candidates)
 - Way to finance existing research & teaching cooperations
