# DIFFERENT PATHS OF BECOMING ICM PARTNERS

- Long history of bilateral cooperation on university level already before ICM
- History of Erasmus KA2 or Horizon project funding, ICM as a tool to widen the scope of cooperation to mobility
- New initiatives on unit level, ICM as one of the first mechanisms of cooperation
