Elena AVGOUSTIDOU-KYRIACOU | Acting Director of the International Relations Service, University of Cyprus, Coordinator of the UNICA IRO Group and IRO Observer to the UNICA Steering Committee | Overall Chair



Elena was born in Nicosia, Cyprus and was educated in the UK. She holds a BSc in Economics (University of Leicester) and an MBA-Finance (Imperial College London). She has been the Acting Director of the International Relations Service of the University of Cyprus (UCY) since 2019 and the Director of the Confucius Institute at UCY since 2014. She is also the UCY Erasmus+ Institutional Coordinator and the Secretary of the UCY International Relations Committee. She has been working in international relations since 1993 and has an expertise

in mobility, international cooperation, international development, cultural diplomacy, as well as international recruitment and promotion and publications.

Anastas GERDJIKOV | Rector, Sofia University "St. Kliment Ohridski" and Member of the UNICA Steering Committee | Welcome address



Prof. Dr. Anastas Gerdjikov is Rector of Sofia University "St. Kliment Ohridski", the oldest and largest University of Bulgaria. Previously he has been Member of the Academic Council, Vice-Rector responsible for Accreditation and Research and Vice-Rector responsible for PhD education of Sofia University, as well as member of the board (2015–2022) and Chairman (2020–2022) of the Bulgarian Rectors' Conference. He graduated with a master's degree in Classical Philology from Humboldt University, Berlin and since 1991 is Professor in Latin language, Ancient and Medieval literature at

Sofia University. He is member of the editorial board of several scientific journals. Along with research publications and monographs in the field of classical philology, he is author of a book and a number of articles on Bulgarian education.

Prof. Gerdjikov has been Vice-Minister of Education and Science, responsible for higher education (2001–2003) and Chief executive of the Bulgarian Science Foundation (2008–2009). As Vice-Minister and later as expert at the Education and Science Parliamentary Committee to the National Assembly of Bulgaria he has participated in the preparation of analyses, laws and regulations in the field of education and science, in particular in the preparation of the chapter on accreditation in Bulgarian Higher Education Law. He has also developed policies and strategies in the field of higher education and scientific research.

Sorin COSTREIE, UNICA President | Welcome address (online)



Prof. Sorin Costreie is Vice-Rector for Public Relations and University Networks of the University of Bucharest. He was previously Vice-Rector for International Relations and Vice-Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy in 2016 and 2017, and is a member of the University Senate since 2011. In between, in 2016, he was Adviser to the Minister and State Secretary in the Ministry of Education and Scientific Research. He was the Head of the Quality Management Department (2008-2016).

He is Associate Professor at the Department of Theoretical Philosophy, University of Bucharest. He holds a PhD in Philosophy (University of Bucharest, 2007), with a thesis in philosophy of mathematics, and pursued further doctoral studies in philosophy of language at the University of Western Ontario, Canada between 2000 and 2008. He has published articles, books and edited volumes with Routledge, Springer, Oxford University Press, Taylor & Francis, Elsevier, Humanitas, University of Bucharest Press, etc.

He was awarded several scholarships and fellowships to study for extended periods in Canada, United States, Germany, Spain, and Italy. His area of interest has lately focused on mathematical cognition and critical thinking. He is member of various professional associations, and since 2014 he is member of the Steering Committee of the European Society of Analytic Philosophy.

Ibrahim YORGUN | Director International Cooperations Office, Middle East Technical University (METU) | Chair and speaker



Ibrahim Yorgun has been working in the METU International Office and in the internationalization policies and strategies area since 2003 and is the Head of the International Cooperations Office at METU since 2019.

He is a member of the UNICA IRO Core Group since 2020, and in 2023 he was nominated as representative of the network in the KA131 Higher Education Working Group.

After a bachelor's degree in political science and international relations at Roma Tre University, an Erasmus exchange experience at Jena University (Germany), she attended a Master in management of cultural diversity at Tilburg University, The Netherlands. She is a member of the Advisory Board at the European Union of Justice, a European, independent, people of colour (POC)-led organisation dedicated to racial and

climate justice. She is also co-founder of the inter-cultural Association "Questa è Roma", created in 2013 and led by a group of young Italians of colour aimed to erase any form of discrimination through culture, politics, social awareness, and art. Recently, she has been teaching with Camilla Hawthorne and Angelica Pesarini about Black

Italy at three editions of the Black Europe Summer School in Amsterdam and she featured in the Vice News Documentary "Black Lives Matter in Italy".

With a career spanning over two decades in the realm of higher education, she has dedicated herself to fostering international collaboration and elevating TSU's global standing.

In her capacity as the head of the Department of Foreign Relations, Tea plays a pivotal role in driving TSU's internationalization efforts. Her responsibilities include cultivating strategic

partnerships with esteemed international higher education institutions, executing bilateral agreements, and overseeing the coordination of joint programs and projects. Under her leadership, TSU has successfully forged connections with more than 200 partner universities and research centers, solidifying its reputation as a global hub of academic excellence.
