


UNICA IROs met for the first time in September 1995, at the University of Lausanne!

... do you remember what the world looked like in 1995?



- Erasmus was growing steadily but still relatively small
- International Offices were beginning to use email regularly.

- Erasmus mobility growing rapidly
- First early discussions on digitalisation of mobility management
- Everyone talked about "internationalisation at home."
- Mobility frozen or cancelled
- Virtual exchanges and online classrooms became survival tool
- Universities created crisis response teams overnight.



- Bologna Process reforms were reshaping degrees;
- ECTS was becoming standard;
- Mobility was still mostly paperwork-driven.

- Erasmus+ (launched in 2014) fully underway;
- Mobility Tool+ used heavily (for better or worse!);
- Internationalisation strategies became central to universities;
- Lots of projects on virtual exchange and blended mobility.



...AND TODAY!?





- Blended mobility is normal;
- Digitalisation of Erasmus processes much more advanced (EWP in everyday use);
- Universities focus on sustainability, inclusion, and global partnerships;
- Al is influencing advising, admin workflows, and student support.



Un programme taillé sur mesure pour "administratifs mobiles"

En juin 1993, le Secrétariat du réseau UNICA introduisait auprès du Bureau Erasmus une demande d'aide financière pour des visites effectuées par le personnel de l'enseignement supérieur.

Ce projet visait à offrir aux responsables administratifs des Universités membres, dont les missions ont une dimension européenne, voire internationale, la possibilité d'effectuer un stage d'une semaine dans un bureau équivalent d'une autre Université UNICA.

Pour les administratifs, les effets induits prévisibles se situaient à plusieurs niveaux:

- enrichissement de leur mission par une approche comparative;
- approfondissement de leur formation en gestion universitaire;
- amélioration des connaissances et de l'expérience du système d'enseignement supérieur du pays visité;
- perfectionnement en langues par une immersion dans le pays même et dans un milieu de travail comparable;
- renforcement du dialogue au sein d'UNICA à un autre niveau de responsabilités et, dès lors, développement des partenariats et de la coopération interuniversitaire.

Vu le succès remporté par ce programme d'échanges auquel ont participé dix candidats, le réseau UNICA a financé la même année un programme similaire sur ses fonds propres, ce qui a permis à six autres candidats d'y participer, notamment à un candidat non-éligible dans le cadre d'Erasmus (voir tableau).

Le but de cette visite à l'Universidade Nova de Lisboa était triple: améliorer mon niveau de portugais, découvrir comment les programmes de mobilité européens sont gérés à Lisbonne et échanger des informations sur le fonctionnement et les programmes de cours de nos universités respectives, afin de pouvoir développer éventuellement des contacts.


UNICA is a pioneer in the promotion of mobilities for administrative staff

UNICA coordinates the project European Campus, which aims to attract students from outside Europe to study at the EHEA, improve information provision, and promote standardisation of HE













2010

UNICA takes part in the ExchangeAbility project, which encouraged a higher number of students with disabilities to go for an exchange.

2015

Building on previous work, UNICA joins the consortium behind the project MappED!, which aimed at creating an online platform that would provide information on support services and mobility opportunities.





2013

UNICA's most successful project, aimed to create an online platform (website) where HEIs can promote their staff trainings and where HEIs' staff can easily find the opportunity they are looking for.


